ROME 23-25 OCTOBER 2022



A worldwide pilgrimage in the spirit of Assisi



"Let us continue to spread the spirit of Assisi, let us continue to live the message of peace!" said Saint Pope John Paul II in the city of St. Francis on the evening of October 27, 1986, at the conclusion of that first historic Day of Prayer.

Representatives of the Christian Churches and of the great religions were invited by him to Assisi since January of that year, the World Year for Peace called by the United Nations. On the afternoon of that Monday in October after an Inauguration Assembly held in the morning at Santa Maria degli Angeli - gathered in prayer in different places, respecting the differences **between their religious traditions,** to invoke the gift of peace for the world from the One who alone can grant it.


Then, in a common procession, representatives of Christians, Jews. Muslims, Buddhists, Hindus, Sikhs, Shintoists, Zoroastrians and indigenous religions made their way to the square in front of the Lower Basilica for the great Final Ceremony of the meeting, great Final Ceremony of the meeting.



Since that year, the **Community of Sant'Egidio** has wanted to repeat in many countries of the world, through an annual stage, wanting to remain faithful to that invitation of Pope Wojtyla

It is a great living icon that, in different colors and languages, has been repainted and reproduced in many European, African, Asian and American cities, including Jerusalem.

King, Pope Francis, and many others.

Rome, the capital of Peace



The last stage of this pilgrimage of men and women of religion, which has crossed the world in the last 35 years, **stopped in Rome the 6th and 7th October 2021.**

Rome has thus become the "capital of peace" with the international meeting "Peoples as Brothers - Future Earth" promoted by the Community of Sant'Egidio in the "spirit of Assisi", after the historic day desired by John Paul II in 1986.

The event brought together the world's great religions together with authoritative representatives of institutions. In a difficult moment of history, because of the pandemic but also because of old and new wars, from the heart of Europe a solemn moment of reflection, prayer and meeting has offered: a message of hope for the future in the name of the greatest good, which is that of Peace.



The Closing Ceremony

After the prayers of the different religions in different places the religious leaders gathered together at the beautiful setting of the Colosseum for the closing ceremony.

The founder of the Community of Sant'Egidio, Andrea Riccardi, and the Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany, Angela Merkel, spoke. Then the speeches of leaders and representatives of religions: the Grand Imam of Al Ahzar, Ahmad Al-Tayyeb; the President of the European Rabbis Conference, Pinchas Goldschmidt and, in conclusion, Pope Francis.

This was followed by a minute's silence in memory of the victims of the pandemic and all wars, and the reading of the 2021 Peace Appeal, which was delivered by a group of children to the ambassadors and representatives of national politics.

Only a limited number of people were able to attend the event in attendance due to the anti-Covid measures in place, but it was possible to follow the meeting via streaming, from around the world, in Italian, English, French, Spanish, Portuguese, German and Japanese.


